School Appeal

Thank you to everyone who made their opinions known regarding helping Danehill Village School which has been facing difficulties in funding due to a combination of government cuts and changes in demographics. The PC approved the proposal for a 10k grant to the school, and together with additional fund-raising initiatives, the school has raised over \pounds 65,000 which will see it through this difficult period.

Important Decisions Taken

The most important decisions taken in recent meetings are summarised below. Full details are contained in the meeting minutes which can be accessed via the Danehill PC website www.danehill-pc.org or ask the clerk for a hard copy if you do not have access to the internet.

Danehill School Support

The PC unanimously approved the proposal for a 10k grant to the school, which had been outlined to the Council in a paper prior to the meeting. The school has been facing difficulties in funding due to a combination of government cuts and changes in demographics. Given the importance of the school and the strength of feeling demonstrated by those who had written to express their views, the PC believed it was in the best interest of the community to grant the request.

Precept/Budget 2017 – 25% reduction in Parish Council Tax versus 2016

The Parish Council (PC) have set and approved the precept (budget) for the next twelve months starting this April. The precept figure is £111k, a 25% reduction on the previous year. This annual spend is roughly an even split between maintaining existing facilities and new projects. Now we have received our council tax bills you can see your contribution to Danehill Parish Council, for most it will be under £200 per annum.

Setting a budget so early in the life of the new council was not easy, we are still forming our ideas and wanted to make sure we had sufficient funds to meet the needs of the parish over the coming year. It's always good to receive feedback from the local community and we had a limited mix of comments regarding where the precept should be set. Since we had reserves some wanted the precept set at zero for this year, others were looking at no change and some said we should increase the precept in line with inflation.

Even though we have set the budget we have agreed that we will still debate and individually approve any major expenditure. This was the case with the school community grant and the same process will apply to new projects such as resurfacing the Jubilee Green pitch & road speed reduction measures. With all decisions we invite input from the community. For those wanting more information, the detailed budget figures can be found on the PC website and any questions addressed to the clerk.

Chairman's Message

Your Parish Council has been extremely busy since Christmas on a range of issues for the community, which are all mentioned elsewhere in this newsletter, however, I would like to focus on our strategy for the future.

When deciding on setting the reduced precept, we were very keen to preserve the surplus funds we inherited from the last Council to improve the facilities within our Parish. We have surplus funds of around $\pounds150,000$, which could be leveraged to obtain grants from the District, sporting bodies and the Lottery for appropriate projects that benefit the community.

We have three ageing village halls and an under-utilized recreation ground, so now is surely the right time to take a fresh look at the facilities needed for our community in the 21st century. At this stage your Council does not have any fixed views, but we do want to get ideas from parishioners of facilities needed for the future. In order to help your Council carry out this forward-looking review, we are considering the engagement of an independent facilitator to guide us and the Community through a structured process. Our surplus funds, together with potential grants, could provide us with an opportunity to transform our parish facilities with no additional charge to the precept, but it will need the support of the whole community to ensure that the correct decisions are made.

In the meantime, I should like to remind you all that on the 27th April we have the Parish Annual Meeting starting at 7.30pm in Chelwood Gate Village Hall. The purpose of this annual meeting is for you to meet your Councillors, hear an overview of what we have been up to and to give us feed back and ideas for the future.

I look forward to seeing as many of you as possible on the 27th.

RECYCLING BINS AT CHELWOOD GATE

Recycling bins have been sited in Chelwood Gate for a number of years courtesy of Chelwood Gate Village Hall (CGVH) Committee in their private car park - this is a facility that benefits the whole community.

On many occasions items have been deposited on the ground around the bins – basically fly tipping for which there is a hefty fine for anyone caught.

CGVH Committee kindly asks that in the event the bins are full, to not leave anything on the ground but instead take it to the Danehill, Forest Row or Maresfield recycling bins/centres. Other items not listed as recycling items should be taken to the Forest Row or Maresfield recycling centres.

It might seem obvious but some people are abusing the system and creating a problem. We do not want parishioners fined or to lose the recycling bins completely. CGVH Committee also request that drivers take special care and consideration of Hall users when entering or leaving the car park.

Traffic Speed Measuring Devices

The PC arranged with East Sussex County Council for a traffic speed measurement exercise to be conducted in the parish in mid-to-late March. Eight locations were chosen where state-of-the-art devices would discreetly record vehicle speeds in both directions, 24 hours a day for one week. Locations were chosen in areas of existing concern - all of them well within 30 or 40 mph limits - i.e. where vehicles should already have slowed down. In particular three devices were located on the A275 (two in Danehill and one in Chelwood Gate), two near Danehill School, and one on each of Freshfield Lane, Stone Quarry Road and Beaconsfield Road.

Whilst the data won't result in penalties or prosecutions for drivers (vehicle details are not recorded), the exercise should provide us with a solid, scientific basis for our future roads strategy and should take some of the guesswork out of a topic that is of great concern to many parishioners.

Defibrillators & Training



The PC has purchased two defibrillators, one sited at each of the village halls. Training is to be provided for up to 20 people and is planned for Tues 2nd May, 6:30pm – 9.00pm at CG Hall. If you would like to volunteer for training please contact the clerk. The training is free and everyone is welcome.

Church Lane, Danehill - Double Yellow Lines - Consultation

East Sussex Highways (ESH) have carried out a consultation exercise (SCH-072) amongst residents local to Church Lane – the PC contacted ESH as some local residents were not contacted. We have been advised that in such an exercise the consultation is aimed specifically at those deemed most 'directly affected' by the works, i.e. 'frontagers'.

Those not 'directly affected' have the chance to support or object to the proposals when ESH publish the traffic regulation order in the local paper and install a notice on site. Ashdown Forest Liaison Panel

The bridge between Braeberrys Gate drive and the ponds has now been replaced thanks to an anonymous benefactor and East Sussex Right of Way. Cattle are still being wintered at Trees Enclosure and come spring/summer a number of enclosures will be erected with either traditional fencing or invisible fencing. Locations of all of these enclosures will be found on the Forest website. In the Education Barn a good number of improvements have taken place including solar panels, boiler and heating replacement, insulation and double glazing. County Council

Responsible for services across the whole of a county: county

- education
- transport
- planning
- fire and public safety
- social care
- libraries
- waste management
- trading standards

District Council

Covers a smaller area than councils. Usually responsible for services like:

- rubbish collection •
 - recycling
- Council Tax collections
- housing
- planning applications environmental health
- including noise polution

Parish Council

Operates below district and county level. They're elected and can help on a number of local issues including:

- allotments, trees on parish grounds ۰
- bus shelters
- burial grounds •
- community centres
- play areas and play equipment
- grants to help local organisations
