2021/22 Precept

Your Council debated the need to recognize the financial pain that many households have gone through over the last year, balanced with the ongoing need to run the Parish day to day, and to be able to maintain and improve our assets.

The Council has decided that the Parish percept should rise by 1% over its 2020/21 level in order to at least meet inflation, which could be higher than this.

The rise is roughly equivalent to £1.50 per household which we feel allows us to run everything, but also minimizes any significant increase in these challenging times

Tree Survey

In Mid December the bi-annual tree survey of four sites within the Parish Council control was conducted by a specialist arboreal company on the state of the trees on Danehill Recreation Ground, Chelwood Gate Village Green, Danehill Burial Ground and Danehill War Memorial Area.

The conclusion was that some trees due to disease and age required felling, however a number required some remedial work in removing dead branches and others needed monitoring for a number of issues during the summer months when in full foliage.

The work required has now been put out to local tree surgeons for tender and will be completed when a decision on the successful tender.

Ashdown Forest News



A large area of the Ashdown Forest is situated within the Parish of Danehill and has been used for many years by parishioners for various leisure activities. As with many projects the finances for the conservation of the forest have been reduced

The Parish Council have been able to help by awarding small grants for the reconstruction of a footbridge, printing of footpath maps and new display signs. The Parish Council now support the Conservators of Ashdown Forest in their Appeal to all parishioners and visitors for voluntary donations to help with the Management of their amenity spaces and car parks
