Spotlight on: - Ashdown Forest

A large area of the north eastern part of the parish is designated as Ashdown Forest. In Norman times this was a deer hunting forest now it is known for certain leisure activities (except drones and cycles) Managed by the Forest Conservators, based just outside of the Parish at The Forest Centre, Colemans Hatch Road, Wych Cross.RH18 5JP.

Visit The Forest Centre when open or the Web site Ashdownforest.org for more information on the Forest Code.

With the main London to Eastbourne road (A22) passing through this part of the parish, a small number of residential properties line area.

Commercial business include:- Llama Park suitable for all the family including cafe shop and tourist information.

Pippingford Park used for Offices, Weddings, Fishing, Corporate and some ticket only public events.

Bonfires

It has been traditional in rural areas like our parish to dispose of unwanted household and garden waste with a bonfire.

There are no byelaws preventing bonfires, so if you decide to have one, you must not cause a statutory nuisance to neighbours or cause anti-social behaviour.

If you have a bonfire, we urge you to be extremely careful.

Burn as far away from your neighbours as possible: **O**nly burn dry material: Burn in the evening when windows are closed: Burn in low wind conditions.

If a neighbour's house has become engulfed by your smoke, please put out your bonfire immediately.

Home Security

In the light of recent events within the Parish it is felt that some ideas for security should be suggested. Condition of all door and window locks checked and replaced if necessary. Extra attention to patio doors.

Do not hang spare keys close to doors. Alarm systems to include garages and outbuildings. CCTV systems. Keep all gates closed at all times if possible. Keep all valuables in the house out of sight or in a safe. Do not leave packaging of recent purchases in view. Arrange for someone to watch the property while you are away.

Report anything suspicious to police and Social Media including any number plates or identifying details seen.

Join the Neighbourhood Watch (in the Know) web site to get regular information and advice to help everyone to be aware of local incidents.
